


MY MINI POND




Old lid (You can also use any container that holds water, like an old washing-up bowl.)

Slope of logs and rocks so that creatures can climb in and out safely.



Dig out a hole to fit the lid.

A log or rocks and pebbles.



Sunny spot away from falling tree leaves.

Fill the pond with rainwater.

Chlorinated tap water is bad for wildlife!



Remember to top up the water if the pond begins to dry out.



These plants keep the pond water clean and filled with oxygen:



MARSH MARIGOLD
(grows at the edge of the pond)


HORNWORT
(an underwater plant)
